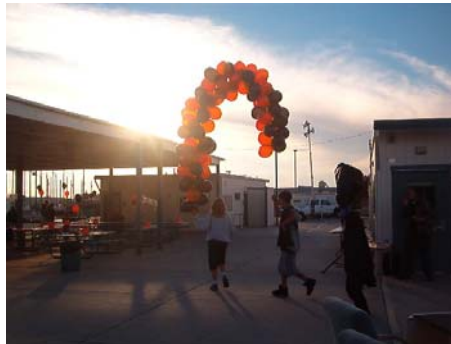
## Services Provided by GRIP:

1. Supervision of daily school attendance
2. Intervention and redirection of inappropriate behavior
3. Alternative ways to deal with conflict
4. Group interaction
5. Problem Solving
6. Drug Prevention
7. Teen Pregnancy Prevention
8. Anger Management Counseling



## Qualifying/Disqualifying Factors:

1. Must be between ages 12 and 17
2. Must attend Valley Community School (Atwater or Merced) and reside in the Merced/Atwater area.
3. Must not have barriers to speaking or understanding English.
4. Must not be a validated gang member
5. Must be at risk of gang involvement
6. Must be able to participate in after-school program
7. Parents agree to have minor participate in after school program
